One weekend, 60+ exhibitions, 70+ events: The annual festival of independent spaces goes into its 2025 edition. All participating spaces collectively invite visitors to explore a multitude of freely accessible exhibitions, combined with a dense program of special events and exhibition openings.

At the heart of the festival is the open house weekend—May 30–June 1—with opening hours at all spaces between 2–6 pm. Many of the exhibitions will remain on display after the festival.


This format creates a yearly snapshot of a diverse scene, and provides a unique opportunity to experience it in an intimate manner, at the locations directly involved with artistic production.

Independent Space Index is an initiative of Viennese independent spaces, aimed at increasing the visibility of independent artistic production, strengthening solidarity among like-minded cultural initiatives, and highlighting their contribution. The network and its festival have been the largest joint endeavour of independent art spaces in Vienna since its founding and first festival edition in 2018.

SUPER is heterogeneous, dense and flawed and resists dissolution and purification. The ambivalence carries SUPER from its space of origin. The lack is a source of inspiration. Cells are omnipresent as the building blocks of life, but are not very present in our human perception, as even the smallest (known) cell cannot be seen with the naked eye. While animal cells, plant and fungal cells as well as the more simply constructed prokaryotes, which include bacteria, are similar in many respects, they have special features. On the billboards, strategies of demarcation and permeability are explored in visual form. Where in some places a semi-permeable membrane regulates the exchange of substances, elsewhere it is the resistant cell wall made of chitin that assumes a fundamental function for the organism. In the outdoor area of the Flucc, an urban gardening project with migrant references is being created that allows borrowed plants to linger under a yurt. In addition, a screening of Kyrgyz documentaries will provide insights into ecological issues, which will be discussed with the filmmakers.

Manuel Gorkiewicz: Hangar

The artist Manuel Gorkiewicz explores the architecture of the "Hangar" in Hall 1 of the Neuer Kunstverein Wien, located in the former exhibition hall of a renowned car dealership. This architectural style was designed in the late 1990s by the firm "Schmidhuber + Partner" for Audi AG. Following the initial prototype, approximately 700 more buildings of this type were constructed worldwide, including the one that now houses the Neuer Kunstverein Wien. Originally, the term "Hangar" referred to a shed or protective shelter and was used for halls housing airplanes, helicopters, and even space shuttles. In the context of automobiles, it connotes high-tech innovation, speed, and avant-garde aesthetics.

Nearly three decades later, Gorkiewicz revisits the metaphor of the "Hangar" in his installation created for the Neuer Kunstverein Wien. His work offers a reflection on the architectural language of the late 20th century, while simultaneously connecting it to the present through artistic interventions by his fellow artists. Various materials—such as high-gloss acrylic fabric, loden cloth, newspaper, and rubber—are integrated into the existing architecture, intertwining with and transforming it. In the newly formed spaces, selected artworks by the artist's friends and colleagues are presented, expanding the narrative of the "Hangar" with individual perspectives.

The artistic project by Manuel Gorkiewicz and the invited artists addresses the dialectics of architectural, functional, and economic parameters within a specific architectural vision. It transforms this building typology by adding a "form of possibility" to its "form of reality."

Our workspace and exhibition area are located in the ORF-Funkhaus as part of the Never At Home project. The exhibition space is on the first floor and can also be accessed via a lift.

ok transit

Entrance at the corner of Paulusplatz 5/Paulusgasse; Ground-floor space without steps. Toilet is unfortunately not barrier-free (even ground, but very narrow).

OpenCave

The OpenCave is barrier-free to visit: the showroom is located directly on the sidewalk and is accessible 24/7; the studio room downstairs is accessible via elevator, but unfortunately we do NOT have a wheelchair-accessible toilet. Please note that we are about 3 minutes walk from the U2 station Donaustadtbrücke. Just go down two levels in the direction of travel out of town (lifts available) until you reach the parking garage entrance and exit; then turn left towards the traffic lights and turn right into Kaisermühlenstraße (approx. 50 m). We are the second building (whitered) and when exhibitions are upstairs in the showroom, we can be seen from the traffic lights (approx. 20 m).

Pech

Just left of the main entrance of the building, three 20 cm steps lead down into the souterrain.

philomena+

philomena+ is located at Heinestraße 40/7 in the second district in a former shop for wool. It has a big showcase which allows you to see the whole space from outside when standing on the large pavement. To enter the space there is one step. The door is quite narrow (71 cm). In the public space in front of the space there are also two billboards (positioned underneath the tree) which are also part of the exhibition presented in the space.
